Venezuela, 1991

- ✓ Fully sanctioned by the Venezuelan swim federation as well as the Olympic Committee whose President inaugurated the event at the “Naciones Unidas” swim complex
- ✓ Clubs representing nine countries attended
- ✓ Meet Director was an experienced swimming official who later became the Federation President and is presently a FINA official
- ✓ Meet was organized by Masters “for Masters” by the Triple Crown Masters Foundation
- ✓ Triple Crown Foundation handled the net income using it for their future objectives

Puerto Rico, 1993

- ✓ International Masters meets remained unknown in the region
- ✓ A few LATyCAR countries started organizing Masters meets
- ✓ FINA had officially taken over from MSI in Indianapolis '92
- ✓ This meet fully sanctioned by the Puerto Rican Federation as well as their Olympic Committee
- ✓ Clubs representing eleven countries attended
- ✓ Meet Director was FINA's Jose de Jesus; LatyCar Honorary member June Krauser was special invitee
- ✓ Meet organization by Masters "for Masters" by Jose de Jesus Jr. and Arnaldo Perez of the Puerto Rican Masters League
- ✓ They managed the finances and net income

Barbados, 1995

- ✓ Masters groups were growing enthusiastically in most of the LatyCar countries
- ✓ Meet fully sanctioned by the Barbados Amateur Swimming Association - BASA
- ✓ Clubs representing fifteen countries attended
- ✓ Meet Director was a BASA official
- ✓ Meet organization by Masters "for Masters" by the Barbados Masters group which worked in conjunction with BASA
- ✓ All finances and net income was managed by the local group
- ✓ Officiating was a point to strengthen for future work
- ✓ Open Waters was introduced as an innovation to the region
- ✓ CONSANAT International meets were born

Mexico, 1997

- ✓ LATyCAR countries were implementing learned experiences and promoting national meets
- ✓ Masters groups kept evolving enthusiastically in most countries of the region
- ✓ This was Mexico's first International Masters event
- ✓ Meet fully sanctioned by the Mexican Swimming Federation and Olympic Committee
- ✓ Clubs representing sixteen countries attended
- ✓ Meet Director was a professional in the swimming industry
- ✓ Meet organization by the Nelson Vargas business group however supervised by local Masters "for Masters"
- ✓ All finances managed by that local company
- ✓ Officiating was improved
- ✓ River Open Waters was fun!

USA, 1999

- ✓ LATyCAR was legally incorporated to promote continental Masters
- ✓ Many Masters swimmers training in most LatyCar countries
- ✓ ISHOF venue
- ✓ Meet approved and thus officially recognized by USMS
- ✓ Clubs representing nineteen countries attended
- ✓ Meet Director was David Morrill with experience in more than 30 championship organizations
- ✓ Meet organization by Masters “for Masters” by the newly formed LATyCAR non profit association
- ✓ All finances were managed by LATyCAR
- ✓ Officiating was greatly improved with USAS officials as well as those invited from four other countries
- ✓ Two distances in the Open Waters event
- ✓ 1,500 meters Postal Event innovated for the region

- ✓ In the ensuing months ASUA & LatyCar would exchange ideas encompassing but not limited to:
 - Work in conjunction with all regional FINA member Federations and in the process:
 - Continue promoting water polo, diving and open waters with a world event in Cuba
 - Publish Masters Rules for regional use based on existing material
 - Gain experience for bidding a 1st. Pan American Masters Aquatic Championship
 - Gain experience for bidding a FINA World Masters Championship in 2004
 - Recognizing that:
 - ASUA would profit with a Masters Program
 - LatyCar would profit with official recognition
 - A strategic alliance between both would be mutually beneficial
 - National Federations would recognize Masters needs:
 - Official centralized information
 - Official centralized direction
 - Official centralized support
 - Official centralized directives
 - Experience in order to evolve properly

- ✓ Meet approved by the Costa Rican Federation and their Olympic Committee
- ✓ LATyCAR donated an entire Colorado Time System for swimming
- ✓ Additionally donated a Colorado Time System for water polo
- ✓ Swimmers from more than twenty nations participated
- ✓ Officials from seven countries officiated
- ✓ Meet Director was a Master swimmer who was the acting Federation President
- ✓ Meet organization assisted by LATyCAR Council Members
- ✓ Losses resulting from the meet were covered exclusively by LatyCar
- ✓ Officiating maintained their above average level by using USAS officials assisted by officials from six other countries
- ✓ Two distances in the Open Waters
- ✓ 1,500 meters Postal Event

- ✓ As result the extensive work with Jerry Olson, an allied continental meet was put "on the back burner" as acting president Carol Zaleski found it difficult to commit, thus
- ✓ LATyCAR promoted within its ranks to include Canada and USA in its next meet and...
- ✓ **ALL AMERICAS** was born for 2005
- ✓ Bid by APMN for Sao Paulo Brazil was won on completeness, their multi-experience and merit of their presentation and included official letters of sanction by ABMN (<http://www.abmn.org.br>) and FAP (<http://www.aquaticapaulista.org.br>) additionally having their Municipal and City letters of support
